



# **OUR STORY**

The Village of Promise story started nearly 70 years ago. Bobby Bradley and Gloria Batts were young girls growing up in a neighborhood in Northwest Huntsville where families supported one another. At the time, it was one of only a few neighborhoods in Huntsville where African Americans owned their own homes, and most households were two-parent families. Parents had hopes and dreams for their children and consequently, children had hopes and dreams for themselves. While Bobby and Gloria were in elementary school in 1956, Catholic nuns and priests, belonging to the Society of the Divine Savior, came from Wisconsin to start a mission school for African American children in their neighborhood.

The mission of the church was to bring quality education to this minority area in Huntsville. With the opening of St. Joseph's Mission School, children in the neighborhood had access to a Christian, high quality education, and this was key to Bobby and Gloria's success. Parents in the neighborhood were supportive and believed that education was the key to success in the segregated society of that time. As Huntsville grew over time, the neighborhood changed, and Bobby and Gloria saw that change. Crime and poverty crept in and the city began to spread out.

As an adult, Gloria saw in her professional career the downward spiral that children and families were experiencing. Bobby was first involved at Lincoln Village Ministry in Huntsville, and through this connection Bobby and Gloria visited the home of a single mother who was living without running water, electricity, furnishings, or food in the cabinets. The shocking reality of this visit inspired Bobby and Gloria to do something to disrupt the cycle of poverty in Huntsville. Rooted in the loving and educated environment in which they were raised, an idea was born to build back their neighborhood and interrupt the cycle of poverty which had overtaken the area. Bobby and Cloria connected with The Harlem Children's Zone (HCZ) in Harlem, NY and were able to use the HCZ as a template and become students of their model. In 2009, an interest group of 9-10 community leaders met to help develop the framework and determine viability of a nonprofit organization to address education and generational poverty.

Early in the formation process, it was decided that VoP would replicate the four basic principles of HCZ: implement best practice programs with proven success, identify and focus on a target neighborhood, partner with others in the community, and show progress towards goals by collecting data and producing metrics. Through community connections, Bobby was introduced to strategic planning consultant Ian Simmons. Mr. Simmons generously worked with the organization to identify neighborhood statistics via census data to determine the target neighborhood.


At the time it was chosen, 48% of the people living in the neighborhood in which VoP decided to focus were below the poverty level, which was the highest in Huntsville. This neighborhood also contained a continuum of schools, which was part of the initial strategy: University Place Elementary School, Ed White Middle School and Butler High School. The neighorhood of focus was originally defined by the boundaries of Holmes Avenue, Oakwood Avenue, Sparkman Drive and Pulaski Pike. All programming was held in public schools that served the families living within the neighborhood. The initial goal of VoP was to break the cycle of generational poverty one neighborhood at a time. To do this, the organization's strategy was to build a pipeline of services from cradle to college focusing on the following four areas as the guiding strategy for the organization: Education, Health, Social Services, and Housing. VoP focused initially on education to optimize its community impact. The organization worked with partners in the community to fulfill any additional needs identified as barriers to success for the scholars and families

the scholars and families. With the solid groundwork having been laid, VoP was incorporated and launched in January 2011, received 501(c)3 status in May 2011, and held its first major event in September 2011 in order to raise funds for the organization. Geoffrey Canada , then CEO of HCZ, spoke to a sold-out crowd in the Von Braun Center North Hall to impress upon Huntsville residents the positive impact that quality education and long-term wholistic support can have on reducing generational poverty. With funding and awareness in place, the employees and volunteers at VoP immediately began to get to know teachers, parents and children in the neighborhood. An after-school tutoring program at University Place Elementary School was launched in September 2011.

In 2015, Village of Promise moved into the Northwoods public housing community, in the VoP target neighborhood, and began providing all programs in classroom space in the Cavalry Hill building. In 2022 the VoP board underwent an extensive strategic planning initiative to provide direction for the next 5 years and refocus the mission of the organization based on the needs of the families served. The current mission reads: Village of Promise empowers families to advance out of poverty using a multi-generational approach, promising support through a continuum of services, and inspiring them to achieve their goals and contribute to their community. Just as the mission has evolved, so have the programs offered by VoP. Starting with tutoring in University Place and Montview Elementary Schools, VoP now conducts Infant, Toddler and Pre-K classes in the facility in Northwoods community. Family and Adult education classes have also expanded to include GED, English as a Second Language (ESL) and Workforce Development training. A complete family on boarding process has been defined and includes setting family goals and connecting families with partner organizations in Huntsville that specialize in services that VoP

does not offer. With the support of the City of Huntsville, numerous local companies and organizations, generous donors, countless volunteers and a dedicated staff, board of directors and advisory council, Village of Promise continues to evolve to meet the needs of families and strives to drive toward its original goal of eradicating generational poverty in Huntsville.

### Leland Melvin Engineer, Educator, Former NASA Astronaut and NFL Wide Receiver

Leland Melvin is an engineer, educator, former NASA astronaut and NFL wide receiver. He served on board the Space Shuttle Atlantis as a mission specialist on mission STS-122 (2008) and STS-129 (2009), helping to construct the International Space Station.

Upon hanging up his space boots, he led NASA Education and co-chaired the White House's Federal Coordination in STEAM Education Task Force, developing the nation's 5-year STEM education plan. After 24 years with NASA as a researcher, astronaut and Senior Executive Service leader, he shares his life story as an athlete, astronaut, scientist, engineer, photographer, and musician to help inspire the next generation of explorers to pursue STEAM careers. Leland holds five honorary doctorates for his service in education, the sciences, and philanthropy. In May 2017, Leland released his memoir, "Chasing Space: An Astronaut's Story of Crit, Crace, and Second Chances." In "Chasing Space," Leland shares his personal journey from the gridiron to the stars, and examines the intersecting roles of community, perseverance, and grace that align to create opportunities for success.
